PREAMBLE

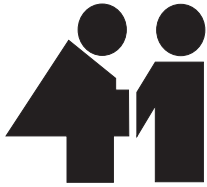

Supervisors and administrators must supervise employees under their direction to ensure that safety practices are observed.

POLICY

THE BOARD WILL MAKE ALL EMPLOYEES AWARE OF SAFETY REGULATIONS; IT SHALL TRAIN EMPLOYEES IN SAFETY PROCEDURES; AND IT WILL FOSTER THE DEVELOPMENT OF ATTITUDES THAT ARE BOTH HEALTH CONSCIOUS AND SAFETY CONSCIOUS.

POLICY

THE BOARD WILL MAKE ALL EMPLOYEES AWARE OF SAFETY REGULATIONS; IT SHALL TRAIN EMPLOYEES IN SAFETY PROCEDURES; AND IT WILL FOSTER THE DEVELOPMENT OF ATTITUDES THAT ARE BOTH HEALTH CONSCIOUS AND SAFETY CONSCIOUS.

ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEDURES

1. For the purpose of monitoring school district safety practices, the Superintendent, or designate, shall establish a District Health and Safety Committee with representatives from the Canadian Union of Public Employees, the Burnaby Teachers' Association, the Burnaby Association of School Administrators, and Board officials.
2. Using the same representation as given in (1) above, the Superintendent, or designate, shall establish individual on-site safety committees to assist the District Committee in carrying out Board policy by conducting safety inspections and by investigating accidents.
3. Supervisors are responsible for ensuring that persons under their direction observe appropriate safety regulations in their daily work.
