Burnaby Mountain is laying claim to the fame of a few of "Canada's" top contenders.

Grade 12 student, Justin Choi, recently made his mark in "Canada's Most Informed Student" Competition. The competition is based on a daily quiz focused on post-secondary and career options, labour market, health & safety, and financial literacy resources. Last spring, Justin was one of 38 competitors of 500 left standing in the 40 day qualifying round. In the final round this past fall, he finished with 394/400 questions correct to tie for 4th place and won a \$500 ChatterHigh Scholarship.

Also, Mountain alumnus and debating coach, Frankie Cena, was a contestant on the pre-holiday competition of *Canada's Smartest Person*.
