## SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT Reporting to Public Session Tuesday, April 9, 2013

## 1. Big Brothers of Greater Vancouver Mentorship Program

The partnership between the Burnaby School District and the Big Brothers of Greater Vancouver originated in 2004 with the inception of *the In-School Mentoring Program*.

The partnership program is a one-to-one encouragement program for boys and girls in grades one to seven, where the participating schools identify students who may benefit from the one-to-one relationship with an adult. The Big Brothers Organization identifies and trains adult "mentors" who meet with their "buddy" for one hour per week at the child's school. Many of the volunteers in Burnaby are members of the RCMP who play games, do arts and crafts or just hang out in the playground with their buddies.

Currently, this program operates in Edmonds, Maywood, Stoney Creek and Stride Avenue Community Schools.

This evening, Director of Instructor, Peter Dubinsky and Coordinator Community Services, Doreen George, will outline the program and showcase an example of this valued partnership opportunity.
