1. British Columbia News Day Student Reporters

Burnaby students were among the 250 entrants at the CBC Vancouver Broadcast Centre competing to secure a place as a News Day Student Reporter. The best news is that 9 of the 30 student finalists were Burnaby School District secondary students, selected after pitching unique and newsworthy story ideas that mattered to them. On Wednesday, March 28th, the student reporters told their stories, their way, as part of CBC's "News Day" student reporter initiative.

On News Day, students hit the streets armed with the latest multimedia technologies and lent their voices to CBC radio, television, online and The Vancouver Sun. Each finalist received a \$1,000 scholarship from Sylvan Learning Centre.

Byrne Creek Secondary School is the first Canadian school to receive this prestigious award from this international educational leadership association.

The ASCD Whole Child Award recognizes schools that move beyond a narrow focus on academic achievement to take action for the whole child, creating learners who are knowledgeable, emotionally and physically healthy, civically active, artistically engaged, prepared for economic self sufficiency, and ready for the world beyond formal schooling.

A team from Byrne Creek, including former principal of the school, Lynn Archer, attended ASCD's 67th Annual Conference and Exhibit Show in Philadelphia from March 23rd-26th to accept the award on behalf of the school and community. Byrne Creek students, families and staff will continue to work with ASCD on a variety of projects over the next year.
