The ceremony closed with final "words of wisdom" and encouragement from Eleanor Hoskins, a grade 12 Burnaby North student, whose prose has been selected each year since grade 3. Following the ceremony, a reception was held in the student commons catered by students from ACE-IT's Professional Cooks Training program.

RICK HANSEN'S 25TH ANNIVERSARY MEDAL RELAY

On August 24, 2011 in Cape Spear, Newfoundland & Labrador, Rick Hansen's 25th Anniversary Medal Relay began. Retracing the Canadian leg of the original Man in Motion tour, the Medal Relay has travelled through more than 600 communities on a nine-month, 12,000 kilometre cross-Canada journey. The 7,000 participating medal-relayers were chosen for the difference they make in others' lives. On May 18, the relay came through Burnaby where Capitol Hill grade 7 student Celia Yu had been chosen to carry the medal from Fell Avenue to Holdom Avenue along Hastings Street. She was cheered on by hundreds of people who came out to show their support.
