### SCHOOL UPGRADES TO CREATE ENERGY EFFICIENCIES TOO

Schools throughout BC will soon benefit from more than \$35 million worth of improvement projects that will be financed through the Provincial Routine Capital Program. Two Burnaby schools, Ecole Aubrey and Stride Avenue Community School, received \$205,800 and \$315,000 respectively. The funding will be used to upgrade boilers and ventilation systems that will ultimately increase energy efficiency and reduce costs. The funding announcement was made at Aubrey Elementary by MLA Richard Lee. He was joined by Board of Education Chair Ron Burton, Trustee Katrina Chen, Superintendent Gina Niccoli-Moen, Secretary-Treasurer Greg Frank, Assistant Superintendent Wanda Mitchell, Principal Merani, parents and students.
