## **Superintendent's Report**

### Community Schools in Burnaby: Partnering with our Community to Promote Healthy Living

Community schools were introduced in Burnaby in 1976 and staff have developed a great many partnerships and relationships with outside organizations since then. Peter Dubinsky, Director of Instruction, shared some examples of what community schools mean for Burnaby and showed the updated Community School Video.

Gayle Bevil, Second Street Community School Coordinator, introduced Denise Dupre from the BCIT nursing program. Ms. Dupre described the nursing students' involvement in a number of Burnaby school initiatives, including presenting workshops on nutrition, wellness, adaption issues faced by new immigrants, infant care and healthy child development, and their involvement with the youth parenting program at Burnaby South. The underlying focus is a deep concern for children and youth.

Bal Dhillon, Byrne Creek Community School Coordinator, highlighted a partnership with the Canadian Red Cross to train youth on issues of bullying, including cyber bullying, and violence prevention. These youth in turn will train younger students in their school community. Students Jasmine Morrison and Francesca Ferrareso described their participation in a two-day violence prevention symposium that covered issues such as communication skills, conflict resolution, sexual and emotional bullying, consent and communication of consent. They looked forward

to leading workshops on these issues and some of the more difficult topics will be presented by the students under the guidance of Mr. Dhillon.

### 2016 World Taekwondo Junior Championships

Over 700 district elementary students recently had the opportunity to attend the 2016 World Taekwondo Junior Championships. The event was organized by the City and Tourism Burnaby in collaboration with the school district and was held at the Bill Copeland Arena from November 16-20. Leadership students from Alpha Secondary School volunteered during the event. Students from Lochdale and Edmonds Community Schools are also hosting Taekwondo workshops taught by local instructors from New Westminster Taekwondo and funded by Tourism Burnaby.

Dino Klarich, Principal of Lochdale, and Sean Gaster, Principal of Edmonds, introduced students who had attended the championships and participated in the workshops. Maria Spagnuolo, Dean Moro, David Cao and Joseph Gebreyes Guillen told Trustees how much they had enjoyed watching the championships and learning a about taekwondo.

Monica Frank, Vice-Principal, Alpha Secondary School, introduced student Josipa Kafadar who participated in the championships and finished eighth in the world. Josipa told Trustees she is looking forward to representing Canada in the Olympics one day.
