# **Burnaby School District Holocaust Symposium**

Approximately 500 Burnaby secondary students will attend the third annual Burnaby School District Holocaust Symposium on November 15th at the Michael J. Fox Theatre. Students will hear from Alex Buckman, a child survivor from Belgium who survived the Holocaust in hiding. Mr Buckman is pictured here on the screen recuperating after liberation in the summer of 1945. In addition, Dr. Jay Eidelman from UBC will speak on "Understanding the Holocaust". The symposium is presented by the Vancouver Holocaust Education Centre which strives to eradicate racism and social injustice by promoting human rights and genocide awareness through education and remembrance of the Holocaust.

#### Green Thumb Theatre Mentors Burnaby Drama Students

Each school, with the guidance and direction of Vancouver's Green Thumb Theatre staff, creates 15 to 20 minutes of original youth-written and performed material. Students from all the participating schools rehearse together at the CBC studios to combine their material into a full-length play. Not only do our students have the opportunity to work collaboratively with others while being mentored by professionals, they will also have their work produced. The show runs December 15th to 17th at the Roundhouse Community Centre Theatre.

Madame Lavorata and her Grade 6/7 class at Ecole Aubrey collected 51 boxes of approximately 2000 food items weighing 587 kilograms, or 1295 pounds, during the month of October. Ms Shelly Nizarm, manager of the food drives for the Vancouver Food Bank, visited Aubrey to thank and acknowledge Ms Lavorata's class for collecting more food than any other school in Metro Vancouver during the Halloween for Hungry campaign.

When, through a series of unfortunate events, a donation of Halloween carving pumpkins to Stoney Creek did not materialize, parent volunteers were sent home and students were disappointed.
