#### Sedin Family Foundation Early Chapter Book Grant

The Sedin Family Foundation generously offered a \$10,000 donation, split into twenty \$500 grants to BC school Libraries for the purchase of early chapter books. In an effort to support student literacy, Inman and Kitchener Elementary Schools applied for the grant. The schools focused on creating Literature Circle Kits that could be implemented with students in grades 2 to 4. Purchasing books that were meant to bridge the gap between picture books and novels for transitional readers was an ideal fit.

The schools' Head Teachers and Teacher Librarians collaborated with classroom teachers to incorporate these novels into student learning. Some examples included students creating skits of poignant aspects of the story similar to a reader's theatre or creating their own retelling or alternate endings, through the use of technology. Both Inman and Kitchener were successful in receiving the grant money. Well done!
