TUITION-FREE?

Secondary students who meet the following criteria are eligible to take tuition-free courses if you:

- are under 19 years old (born after June 30, 2006)
- are a Canadian citizen, permanent resident or convention refugee
- attended a BC school in the 2024-2025 school year
- and your parent/guardian currently reside in BC
- □ have a BC Personal Education Number (PEN)

Students who have completed Grade 7 or 8 may take <u>one</u> tuition free course. Students who have completed Grade 9, 10, 11 or 12 may take up to <u>two</u> tuition free courses.

- Transfers & refund requests must be made by noon on July 7, 2025.
- Those not eligible, or those signing up for courses requiring fees can pay by Visa or Mastercard.

Daily Attendance

Daily attendance is crucial for student success. Students are expected to arrive on time every day, and be prepared to work and participate fully in class.

Given the rapid and condensed pace of Summer Session, extended absences for any reason are not accommodated. These include, but are not limited to, work, vacations, sporting events, games/ practices, or family commitments.

Learning Support

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If your child has an Individualized Education Plan (IEP) and/or a Fraser Health Care Plan and is currently receiving additional learning support provided by an Education Assistant (EA) at school, we encourage you to complete the online registration **by May 3** to evaluate the level of support necessary for your child. PRE-APPROVAL INFORMATION

IF THE FOLLOWING APPLIES TO YOUR CHILD, THEN FORMS MUST BE SUBMITTED ONLINE FOR PRE-APPROVAL:

- The student is currently attending Grade 12 in a Burnaby public school, OR
- The student is new to a Burnaby public school this year and began after February 19, OR
- The student's school is outside of the Burnaby School District

Upon approval, you will receive notification about your eligibility to register for Summer Session courses with the Burnaby School District.

Please be sure to have the following documents ready during the online registration process:

- Proof of student's birthdate: birth certificate or passport
- Proof of guardianship: parents' or guardians' as shown on birth certificate or other appropriate legal documentation such as landed immigrant papers or guardianship "order" granted by the courts
- Proof of citizenship for both parent and the student: Canadian birth certificate, citizenship card, passport, landed immigrant document, permanent resident card
- Proof of residency of the parent/guardian and student. Two pieces required, with <u>at least one being</u> from Category A:
 - Category A: proof of ownership of dwelling (i.e. purchase contract, property assessment, annual municipal utility/tax statement); long term lease/ rental agreement; parent or guardian's income tax return or notice of assessment from Revenue Canada
 - Category B: BC Hydro bill, BC cable bill, provincial driver's license, provincial registration of automobile, Canadian bank account or credit card statement
- Copy of student's most recent school marks: report card or transcript of academic record
- BC Personal Education Number (PEN)
- IEP (Learning Support, if applicable)

A refundable \$100 textbook deposit is required at the time of registration.

This includes all grade 8-12 academic courses (regular, preview and advance credit)

Grade 7/8 Transition (going into Grade 8)

Are you on your way to secondary school in September? Grade 7/8 Transition is designed to help students navigate the transition between elementary and secondary school.

Crafting our Digital Futures: Digital Literacy Through Art and Story

This session is offered in collaboration with the Burnaby School District, SFU's Digital Democracies Institute and SFU's School of Communication.

Crafting Our Digital Futures: Digital Literacy Through Art and Story is a summer course developed and run by educators from the School of Communication in partnership with FCAT, the Imaginative Methods Lab (SIAT) and the Burnaby School District.

This course is designed around a series of discussions, hands-on workshops, and making activities that engage with some of the biggest questions in digital media: How does social media learn our preferences and shape our view of the world? What are the values and opinions embedded within algorithms? How does Al blur the boundaries between fact and fiction? How can communities challenge big tech?

Each week students will tackle a unique theme and issue using both analog and digital tools that seek to develop their critical making skills, while crafting alternative visions for our digital futures. Ultimately, students will gain a sense of control over their datafied selves and the digital tools they use everyday.

Architecture Introduction

July 3-18 | 8:45 am-12:05 pm | Moscrop | Course #4405

This course provides a foundation in architectural design, drafting, and modeling. Students will develop basic hand drafting skills and use 3D modeling software to design a house. The course introduces key architectural concepts, including form, function, and spatial organization, while also teaching students how to create and interpret building blueprints. By the end of the course, students will have a solid understanding of architectural fundamentals and a completed house design project.

Badminton Skill Development

Students with all skill levels will be given the opportunity to improve their game. Instruction on fundamental badminton skills, rules and strategies, while developing balance and coordination.

Basketball Skills Development

Coding

Students will learn basic coding skills. Course project will involve problem solving and creative components.

Drama & Music

This is an inclusive, mixed-media course designed to give you an introduction into the worlds of drama and music. There will be an emphasis on using drama to spark imagination, innovation, creativity, flexibility, and self-confidence. Students will develop their dramatic skills through character and scene building, with a concentration on the importance of body movement, vocal flexibility, role creation, scene elements and scene structure. They will also learn how to sing, read musical notation, and learn the songwriting and video editing skills to create their own music video. Through these exercises students will discover social and cultural connections inherent to the purposes of drama and music within school, family, friends, and the greater community.

Fitness and Conditioning

July 3-18 | 8:45 am - 12:05 pm | Moscrop | Course #4460

Opportunity to learn how to properly exercise and develop your fitness. The program will focus on a wide range of physical traits such as flexibility, strength, speed, agility and stamina. Participants will also receive advice and instruction on nutrition, the importance of recovery and the prevention of injury. All that is required of the participant is their motivation and a willingness to work hard.

French Immersion Preparation

July 3-18 | 8:45 am - 12:05 pm | Moscrop | Course #4401

This course will help you improve all your French skills and prepare you for your next French Immersion class! We will work on vocabulary, comprehension, speaking and writing. Themes and topics will be chosen as a class.

FUNdamentals of Activity

July 3-18 | 8:45 am - 12:05 pm | Burnaby North | Course #1411

FUNdamentals promotes physical literacy, through a variety of drills and games that focus on fundamental movement skills (i.e. throwing, catching, kicking, etc). This course is intended to help students be more successful in a PHE environment.

Introduction to Art

In this three week intensive introduction to Art you will be learning about different mediums in art. You will hand build in clay, explore acrylic paint, watercolour and pencil. If you want to become an artist or you would like to level up your art skills, then this will be the perfect space for you.

Photography

In this course we explore the fundamentals of photography through fun and hands on activities. We encourage students to take thoughtful and creative images while exploring different composition techniques and camera settings.

S.T.E.A.M

July 3-18 | 8:45 am - 12:05 pm | Burnaby North | Course #1496

Participants will learn to develop, create, implement, and assess a STEAM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts, and Mathematics) program, lessons and units. A variety of frameworks will be reviewed and discussed to allow for easy replication of STEAM units and activities. Inquiry-based lessons for instruction and assessment will be explored to gain a better understanding of possible classroom applications and projects.

Volleyball Skill Development

This course is an activity class providing students with the skills and knowledge to play and enjoy volleyball. Emphasis is on basic/advance fundamental skills, rules and terminologies, team offense and defense drills and game situational strategies.
